PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

REQUIREMENTS:

- At least a 3.0 GPA in major and overall (3.5 GPA or higher is preferred).
- Junior or Senior Standing (Students considering applying to graduate school in the fall of 2014, for matriculation to a program in 2015).
- Strong Interest in Pursuing Graduate Studies, specifically a Ph.D. Program (All majors welcomed).
- Come from a historically underrepresented background in higher education, including Black/African American, Latino/Hispanic American, & American Indian/Native American.
- SUBMIT: (1) online application (<u>http://bit.lv/1jAMoUB</u>); (2) CV/Résumé; (3) Reference (Contact Information <u>or</u> Letter); & (4) Two-Page Essay on how the program can assist you <u>or</u> a Sample Personal Statement/Statement of Purpose.
- Be available ALL DAY to accommodate travel arrangements on Wednesday, March 12, 2014 & Friday, March 14, 2014.

SCHOLARSHIPS, TRAVEL, AND PROGRAM-RELATED DETAILS:

Selected students will receive a Scholarship from the USC Graduate School, Office of the Provost, which will be used to cover all travel and programrelated expenses including flights, ground transportation, parking, lodging (if required), meals, and workshops. If students have access to their own institutional travel funds (not required) and would like to use them, they should contact the program office (contact information noted below).

DUE DATES, APPLICATION PROCESS, AND CONTACT INFORMATION:

- Step One: Complete your online application (http://bit.ly/ljAMoUB) and submit all required documents by Monday, February 24, 2014, *before* 9:00 a.m. Pacific Standard Time.
- Step Two: Acceptance Letters will be sent beginning Wed., Feb. 26, 2014, along with instructions on booking flights and other program details.
- Step Three: If selected, and if you need a flight, be prepared to make your reservation with USC, via STA Travel Representatives, between February 26th and 28th, 2014. Due date to book flight: February 28th, 12 p.m. Pacific Standard Time. The cost of your flight will be covered. Notes for Selected Students: All hotel arrangements will be made on your behalf. If you <u>DO NOT</u> need a hotel and flight, specify this in your application. If you drive in <u>AND</u> do not stay at the hotel, the program will cover parking. Note this in your application.
